Coach and group tours

We warmly invite you to visit the historic gold mining village of Nundle, cradled between the Peel River and the western fall of the Great Dividing Range. We hope you are uplifted by the beauty of the surrounding hills and countryside, take in the peace and tranquillity of the village, and enjoy meeting some of the people who make our community a great place to live. It is easy to fill a day in Nundle. There is so much to see and do that you may even want to stay overnight.

1. MILL PACKAGE, \$3 per person

A member of the Nundle Woollen Mill team will guide your group on a half-hour tour explaining why the mill is in Nundle, its important role as a local employer, the seven stages of wool processing on site, and a brief background of the historic machinery.

From the safety of our mezzanine your group will see the day's activities on the factory floor, which could be any stage of wool processing from opening bales of scoured wool, to carding, twisting, plying, hanking, dyeing, coning or balling.

After the tour your group will see the exciting end product in our factory shop, 8, 12 and 20 ply wool in 48 shades (including some factory seconds for the bargain hunter) and knitwear handmade with Nundle Woollen Mill yarn. To make your visit even more special we have about 100 exotic French and Italian yarns, stylish wool fashion by Jac+Jac, Sheer Bliss, Tooralie, dlux, and Paul Salon, and exquisite homewares imported direct from India.

2. PICNIC PACKAGE, \$5-\$10/person

Our picnic package includes your half-hour guided tour, plus morning or afternoon tea or lunch in the landscaped mill grounds. Slices are home baked and sandwiches are freshly made by Nundle ladies. There is ample seating and we have trellises and tree plantings to provide shade.
